50 Years — Parron Hall Office Interiors

Although Parron Hall was founded in San Diego in 1947, its roots extend back four generations to the 1880's when L.B. Herr founded L. B. Herr & Sons in Lancaster, Penn.

Jim Herr, president of Parron hall, is L.B. Herr's great, great grandson and a native San Diegan who spent his youth working in the family business.

Today Parron Hall is one of San Diego's most established office interiors businesses; 1997 sales are estimated at \$14 million. Parron Hall provides office furniture, design services, warehousing and installation to a cross-section of San Diego's businesses and governmental agencies.

Under Jim Herr's leadership, Parron Hall weathered the devastating economic recession of the 1990's without laying off one employee. In fact, more than half of Parron Hall's 40 employees have been with the firm for more than

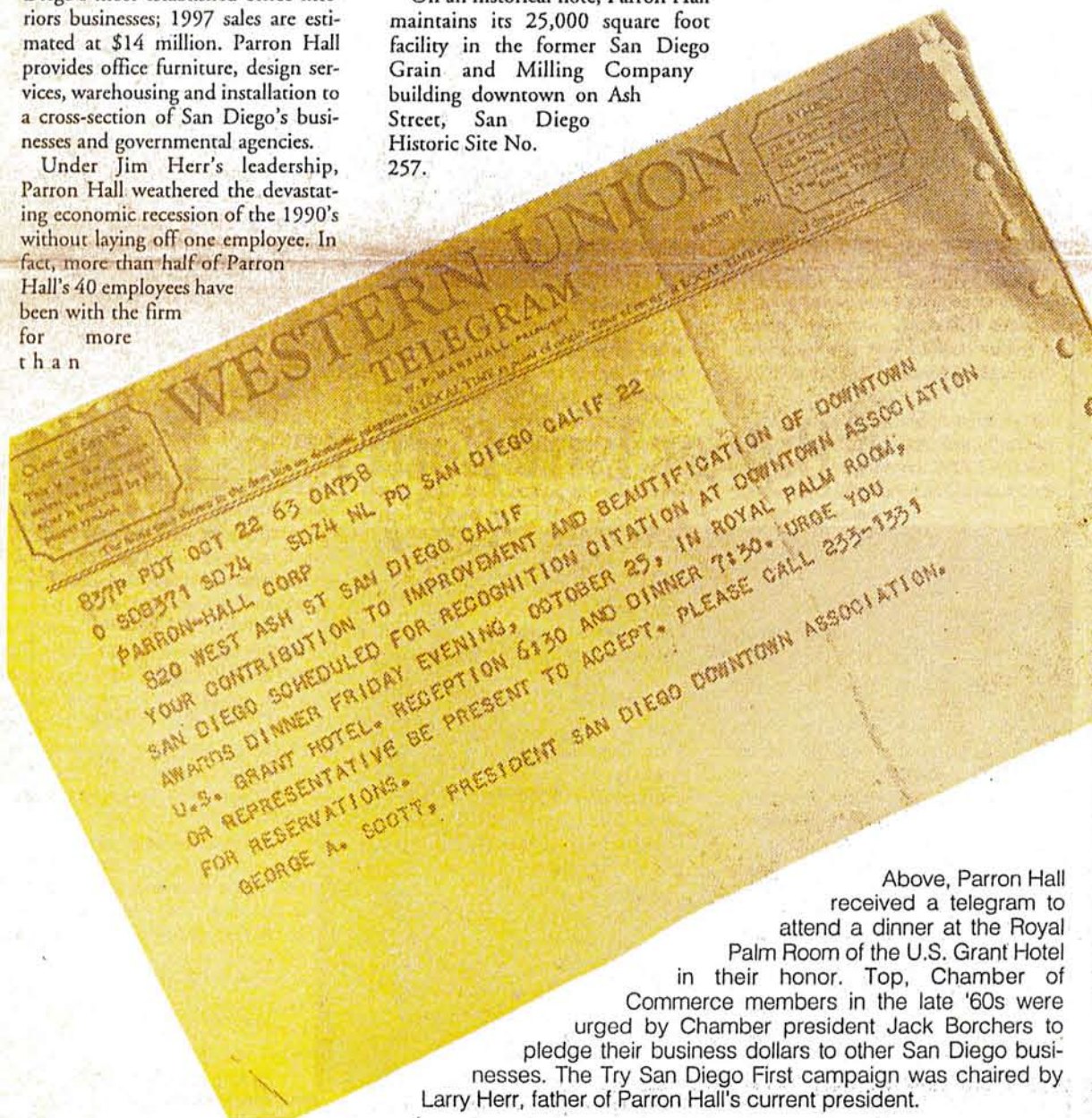
10 years. The company attributes its longevity to long-term client and employee relationships.

Parron Hall has been a devoted advocate of downtown for five decades. Dating back to the 1960s, Parron Hall received accolades from the then-San Diego Downtown Association for "their improvement and beautification of downtown." The firm was also actively involved with the San Diego Chamber of Commerce's early "Try San Diego First" business campaign.

On an historical note, Parron Hall maintains its 25,000 square foot facility in the former San Diego Grain and Milling Company building downtown on Ash Street, San Diego Historic Site No. 257.

Constructed in 1909, the building is deemed significant for its early use in San Diego industry.

Throughout the years, Parron Hall has sought to fulfill each generation's need for comfortable, productive and effective work environments. As it celebrates its 50th anniversary, Parron Hall remains committed to providing San Diegans with quality office furniture and the highest level of professional service.
